Key Achievements and Activities

Hope House



Hope House cared for total of forty-two (42) clients in 2018. Twenty two (22) in house clients, twenty (20) out clients and Nine (9) domestic violence.

In the areas of academics, after school home lesson was continued for clients to improve their academic performance. Vocational training was done, the clients were taught bead making, tie and dye, tailoring and how to make snacks. The clients were trained and certified on computer appreciation and music.

Social functions have been a regular for the clients as there were series of outings and visitations. This visits have facilitated scholarship awards to some of the girls, in-kind donations of food items, toiletries, provisions, and clothes reducing the financial burden of the organization. The program Renewed Hope held in the shelter, has ensured clients encounter notable people of all works of life, come with encouragements, and gifts.

However, with directives from the Board of Trustees, the activities of Hope House is on hold. All the clients have been reconciled with their families except for three (3) clients that were transferred to another shelter.

Girls Empowered 2018



According to Kathy Calvin, United Nations Foundation President & CEO "Girls are one of the most powerful forces for change in the world: When their rights are recognized, their needs are met, and their voices are heard, they drive positive change in their families, their communities, and the world."

It was therefore the need to empower the girl child and make them understand that they can be more which is in line with 2018 international day of the girl child themed, "With Her: A Skilled GirlForce."

The Girls Empowered Conference 2018 is focused on empowering girls through Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics." The aim of this year's Girls empowered programme is to educate the girl child on making career choice in STEM, leveraging opportunities for technology, social media utilization and internet security. A total of 374 students from 13 schools in education district 2, 4 and 6 were reached.

Peer Education for Prefects (PEP) is a transformative civic education and leadership initiative that selects students with leadership potential from public secondary schools in disadvantaged communities in Nigeria, and provides a peer-learning recreational environment to build their capacity to become responsible citizens and leaders.

PEP 2018 reached a total of 234 school prefects from nine (9) schools, the school prefects were trained on Leadership, Who Am I? (Self-Profiling) and Personality development. There would be book review sessions and presentation by each group in 2019. A Leadership Self-Assessment Questionnaire was administered to the prefects to test their knowledge on leadership.

The foundation has approval to host Peer Education for Prefects (PEP) in Ifo Local Government Area of Ogun State, this is the first in a series to Ogun State.

The foundation is in the process of developing a PEP training manual which will be used as a guide for PEP in 2019.

SHARP is focused on raising awareness, fostering prevention, counseling victims, a measure that has proven effective in substantially lowering the risk of being sexually assaulted.

In continuing advocacy on prevention and sensitization, the foundation facilitated at the University of Lagos (UNILAG) FM Talk Show to sensitize the public on Sexual Abuse addressing the student community. Other Tertiary Institutions visited included Yaba College of Technology (YABATECH) Association of Statistics Students of Nigeria(ASSON) Conference 2018.

The foundation sensitized teenagers at the Redeemed Christian Church of God (RCCG) Magodo GRA Isheri, RCCG Magboro and pupils of Air Force Primary School 2, Sam Ethnan Air Force Base Ikeja, Lagos. Speaking engagement on Sexual violence and its effects at Executives Initiaves Gbagada. This is an ongoing advocacy on sensitization and prevention of sexual abuse.

In celebrating the International day of the African Child, the foundation hosted girls in secondary schools on Wednesday 27th, 2018. The 2018 theme is "Leave No Child Behind for Africa's Development". PBOF theme for this year is "Enhancing Awareness on Sexual Health and Preventing Harassment.

The foundation also reached out to Parents Teachers Association (PTA) of schools. The parents were enlightened on Child Protection Policies, how to prevent sexual abuse and steps to take when there is an abuse.

A total of 21,090 were reached.

Due to increasing overhead costs and running expenses, the administrative office was moved to the shelter. The foundation is currently looking out for new office space as the shelter rent will be due March 2019


Transportation:
